LOGLINE, THEME, SYNOPSIS

THE FILM

A 90 minute drama made for the cinema.

THE LOGLINE

A woman's desire to make peace with her dark past through an encounter with a stranger.

THE THEME

Alienation and Liberation.

SYNOPSIS

Loosely based on the mass rapes of Chinese Indonesian women during the May 1998 riots in Indonesia, this film tells the story of May (14) who was gang-raped 8 years ago. Traumatized by the event, May imprisons herself in her father's house, blocking out all emotions by constructing a protective bubble around her. While May lives her life in silence, without contact or emotions, her father is trapped by guilt, devastated that he failed to keep her safe. With May, he is tender and gentle. He will sacrifice anything for her. But in the boxing ring, he fights to channel all his anger and guilt. After 8 years, a magician creates a small crack in May's protective wall. He stirs May's sense of wonder and in doing so awakens her once lost emotions. Eventually May faces her trauma and frees herself from her crippling past.



DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

My childhood experience of being a Hindu of Indian origin living in a Muslim dominated Indonesia has led me to an on going obsession with the theme of isolation and alienation. I have explored this theme extensively in my previous films; a man's relentless obsession in "The Rainmaker," and a son's longing for his estranged father's acceptance on a fishing platform in the middle of the sea in "Jermal." Yet, I sense that I still have not exhausted the topic and subsequently feel the need to tell more stories on the subject.

Another starting point for this film is the May 1998 riots, where incidents of mass violence, rapes and looting of a racial nature occurred throughout Indonesia that eventually lead to the resignation of President Suharto. The main targets of the violence were ethnic Chinese Indonesians. At least 168 cases of rape were reported while thousands others died.

Since we wanted to avoid making a political film, we focused the drama on just one family. I wanted to illustrate how the pain and wounds, which happened in a flash, had devastating effects that can last a lifetime for the victims and their family. Though this film ends with hope, I believe there are millions of other Mays and their families who have not taken the first step towards healing and recovery, or are still struggling to make any kind of progress.

The May 1998 tragedy is at risk of being buried forever without the facts ever being revealed, unless a worthy government comes to power in Indonesia with the courage to uncover the truth. Not one President since the atrocities has publicly apologized to the families of the victims or provided them with compensation.

Presently this film finds its relevance in unraveling these dark events of the past. However, on a more urgent note, we would like to pressure the current government to pass the Elimination of Sexual Violence (RUU PKS) bill that is still being discussed in parliament. While this bill remains stuck, statistics show that every two hours, three women in Indonesia experience sexual violence, and these are only the reported ones.

It is our hope that "27 Steps of May" can play a role in raising awareness and empathy for victims of sexual violence. But more importantly, we would like to not let this film remain just a film. This theme should become a larger movement where we can help push the agenda to uncover the truth of May 1998 and to finally pass this law, so we never have to discover other Mays in the future.

RAVI BHARWANI DIRECTOR / PRODUCER

RAVI BHARWANI graduated from the Jakarta Institute of the Arts (IKJ) in 1990. After directing several commercials, documentaries, short movies and made-for-TV movies, he made his feature film The Rainmaker which premiered in Busan International Film Festival - Asian New Current.
